**ORDINANCE NO. 2008-222**

**"PRIVATE VEHICLE SALES"**

**AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE CODIFIED ORDINANCES OF WORCESTER TOWNSHIP, PART II (GENERAL LEGISLATION), CHAPTER 150 (ZONING) BY ADDING A NEW SECTION 150-194.1 ENTITLED "PRIVATE VEHICLE SALES" IN ORDER TO REGULATE THE SALE OF NON-COMMERCIALY OWNED VEHICLES.**

The Board of Supervisors of Worcester Township does hereby **ENACT and ORDAIN:**

**SECTION I. Amendment to the Code.**

The Codified Ordinances of Worcester Township, Part II (General Legislation), Chapter 150 (Zoning), is hereby amended by adding a new Section 150-194.1 entitled "Private Vehicle Sales" as more fully set forth below:

**§150-194.1 Private vehicle sales.**

- A. The on-lot display for private sale of autos, motorcycles, trucks, other over-the-road vehicles, motorized recreational vehicles, all-terrain vehicles, campers and boats of all types is prohibited in all zoning districts except as specifically permitted in this section.
- B. Property owners or occupants of properties are permitted to display one non-commercially owned auto, motorcycle, truck, other over-the-road vehicle, motorized recreational or all terrain vehicle, camper or boat for private sale on the property they occupy for a maximum period of thirty (30) days, no more than two times per calendar year, provided there is a minimum of sixty (60) days between such displays for sale and the item for sale is lawfully owned for non-commercial purposes by the owner or occupant of the property where the on-lot display is located.

- C. The property owner or occupant shall file a registration statement with the Township on a form provided by the Township at least two (2) but not more than ten (10) business days prior to the commencement of the sale. The registration statement shall include the following information:
- (1) The name, residence address and telephone number of the property owner or occupant conducting the sale.
  - (2) The make, model, license plate number and vehicle identification number of the vehicle intended to be sold.
  - (3) The commencement date of the sale and the date on which the sale will end.
  - (4) A certification signed by the property owner or occupant that he or a member of his immediate family is the registered owner of the vehicle to be sold.
  - (5) A copy of the certificate of title or registration for the vehicle shall be attached to the registration statement.
- D. Any such displays shall not create a hazard for passing motorists by obstructing required views or causing a distraction. Signs for such displays shall be no larger than 18 inches by 24 inches, must be affixed to the item displayed for sale, and shall otherwise comply with the requirements contained in Article XXI (Signs).

**SECTION II. Repealer.**

All other ordinances and resolutions or parts thereof as they are inconsistent with this Ordinance are hereby repealed.

**SECTION III. Severability.**

The provisions of this Ordinance are severable, and if any section, sentence, clause, part or provision hereof shall be held illegal, invalid or unconstitutional by any court of competent jurisdiction, such decision of the court shall not affect or impair the remaining sections, sentences, clauses, parts or provisions of this Ordinance. It is hereby declared to be the intent of the Board that this Ordinance would have been adopted even if such illegal, invalid or unconstitutional section, sentence, clause, part or provision had not been included herein.

**SECTION IV. Failure to Enforce Not a Waiver.**


The failure of the Township to enforce any provision of this Ordinance shall not constitute a waiver by the Township of its rights of future enforcement hereunder.

**SECTION V. Effective Date.**

This Ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its approval as required by the law.

**ORDINANCE NO. 2008-223**

**AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE CODIFIED ORDINANCES OF WORCESTER TOWNSHIP, CHAPTER 110 (PEACE AND GOOD ORDER), SECTION 110-2 (VIOLATIONS AND PENALTIES) IN ITS ENTIRETY AND REPLACING IT WITH A NEW SECTION 110-2 ENTITLED "VIOLATIONS AND PENALTIES" TO INCREASE THE FINE FOR EACH OFFENSE UNDER CHAPTER 110 FROM AN AMOUNT NOT EXCEEDING TWENTY-FIVE DOLLARS (\$25.00) FOR EACH OFFENSE TO AN AMOUNT NOT EXCEEDING ONE THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$1,000.00) FOR EACH OFFENSE.**

The Board of Supervisors of Worcester Township does hereby **ENACT and ORDAIN:**

**SECTION I. Amendment to the Code.**

The Codified Ordinances of Worcester Township, Chapter 110 (Peace and Good Order), Section 110-2 (Violations and Penalties) is hereby amended by deleting Section 110-2 in its entirety and replacing it with a new Section 110-2 entitled "Violations and Penalties" as follows:

**§110-2. Violations and Penalties.**

Any person or persons violating any of the provisions of this Chapter, or causing or helping others violate the same, shall be guilty of the offense of disorderly practices and, upon conviction thereof in summary proceedings, shall be sentenced to pay the cost of prosecution and a fine not exceeding One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00) for each offense. Where the circumstances of the offense are continuous, a new and separate offense shall be deemed committed for each day that such violation exists.

**SECTION II. Repealer.**

All other ordinances and resolutions or parts thereof as they are inconsistent with this Ordinance are hereby repealed.

**SECTION III. Severability.**

The provisions of this Ordinance are severable, and if any section, sentence, clause, part or provision hereof shall be held illegal, invalid or unconstitutional by any court of competent jurisdiction, such decision of the court shall not affect or impair the remaining sections, sentences, clauses, parts or provisions of this Ordinance. It is hereby declared to be the intent of the Board that this Ordinance would have been adopted even if such illegal, invalid or unconstitutional section, sentence, clause, part or provision had not been included herein.

**SECTION IV. Failure to Enforce Not a Waiver.**


