We believe that Variety is an important resource in the County and Township and we hope to strengthen and enhance Variety's partnership with Worcester Township through the implementation of the master plan vision.





# Located in the center of Worcester Township and in the heart of Montgomery County, Variety is ideally located to serve a large part of the Delaware Valley.






### Vision Statement: Variety - The Children's Charity of the Delaware Valley seeks to





## Variety Campus Master Plan

The Variety Campus Master Plan creates a vision for building and site improvements over the next 20 years, to accommodate the institution's renewed emphasis on expanded vocational training for its clients. The Master Plan re-imagines the campus to create a more beautiful, inviting and sustainable environment that both honors Variety's history and creates new and upgraded facilities for the future. The master plan optimally utilizes the site, provides stewardship of existing natural resources and respects neighbors' privacy. The plan provides for more functional and efficient vehicular circulation and creates a campus that is 100% universally accessible.

The future campus should instantly convey the institution's mission, its welcoming environment and its focus on stewardship. The new Variety Camp campus should help create more visibility for the institution in both Worcester Township and Montgomery County, and serve as a model for universal and inclusive design.

### AGR AGRICULTURAL DISTRICT

### **Permitted Uses:**

- Agriculture.
- Single-family detached dwellings:
- Accessory uses

### **Conditional Uses:**

- Country club
- Public or private schools
- Noncommercial playing fields, parks, playgrounds, passive recreation areas, nature preserves, forest preserves and nature centers
- Place of religious worship
- Day camp
- A farm market or roadside
- A residential life-care facility
- Municipal use
- No-impact home-based business



### AGR AGRICULTURAL DISTRICT

### Yard regulations.

Nonresidential uses. All nonresidential uses shall be governed by the following yard requirements:

Two hundred fifty feet shall be the minimum size of front yards and 125 feet shall be the minimum size of side and rear yards for all structures except single-family detached, religious and agricultural uses.

### Coverage regulations.

- Building coverage: Ten percent maximum
- Impervious coverage: Twenty percent maximum

### Height regulations.

- Building height. Thirty-five feet, not exceeding 2.5 stories
- Sixty feet shall be the maximum height for silos used to store ensilage.
- Eighty-five feet shall be the maximum height for steeples and/or bell towers of places of worship.



### CONDITIONAL USES.

The Supervisors may grant approval provided that the following standards are met.

- Complies with the declaration of legislative intent as stated in Article I
- Compliance with conditions of the conditional use
- Shall not adversely affect neighboring land uses in any way and shall not impose upon its neighbors in any way
- Properly serviced by all existing public service systems.
- The peak traffic accommodated for in a safe and efficient manner
- Accommodated by other public service systems including police, fire protection, utilities, parks and recreation.
- Properly designed with regard to internal circulation, parking, buffering and all other elements of proper design.
- Provide sufficient plans, studies or other data
- Other conditions including planting and buffers, harmonious design of buildings.

### **EXPIRATION OF CONDITIONAL USES.**

Unless otherwise specified in the decision of the Board of Supervisors, a conditional use shall expire if the applicant fails to obtain a building permit in connection therewith within one year of the date of the order of the Board or court granting such conditional use. In those instances where land development or subdivision approval is a necessary prerequisite prior to obtaining a building permit, the conditional use shall expire if the applicant fails to make a diligent effort to obtain such approval within six months following the date of conditional use approval. Upon receipt of land development approval, the conditional use shall expire if a building permit is not obtained within six months of the date of land development approval

## **Moving Forward**

Realization of a new Variety Campus will require a number of years. Since Variety is a donor supported organization, the long-term Vision for the institution is key to garnering long-term and continuing support. Donors must know that their investment in the institution is protected.

The campuses current zoning status does not ensure the long-term viability of the institution. Additionally, donors cannot be assured that their investments will bear fruit if every campus enhancement might be subject to a new public hearings and approvals.


Variety is interested in partnering with Worcester Township to determine the best way to ensure that the institutional goals for the master plan are met while the interests of the Township and community
