- The Township's composting facility is located here, offering a sustainable solution for yard waste and brush recycling.
- There are no athletic fields, picnic tables, or active recreation areas — keeping the site quiet, natural, and low-impact.

- **Environmental Benefits:** Composting helps Worcester reduce landfill waste while supporting local landscaping and stormwater efforts with natural mulch and soil products.
- **Passive Recreation:** The open grassy areas and trail offer an easy place for walking, reflection, or light outdoor activity.

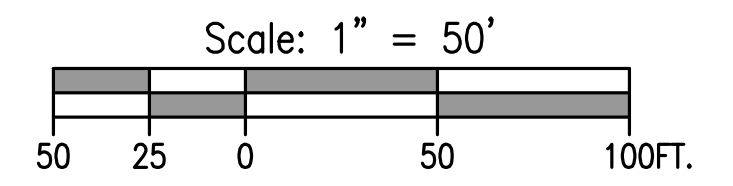
